

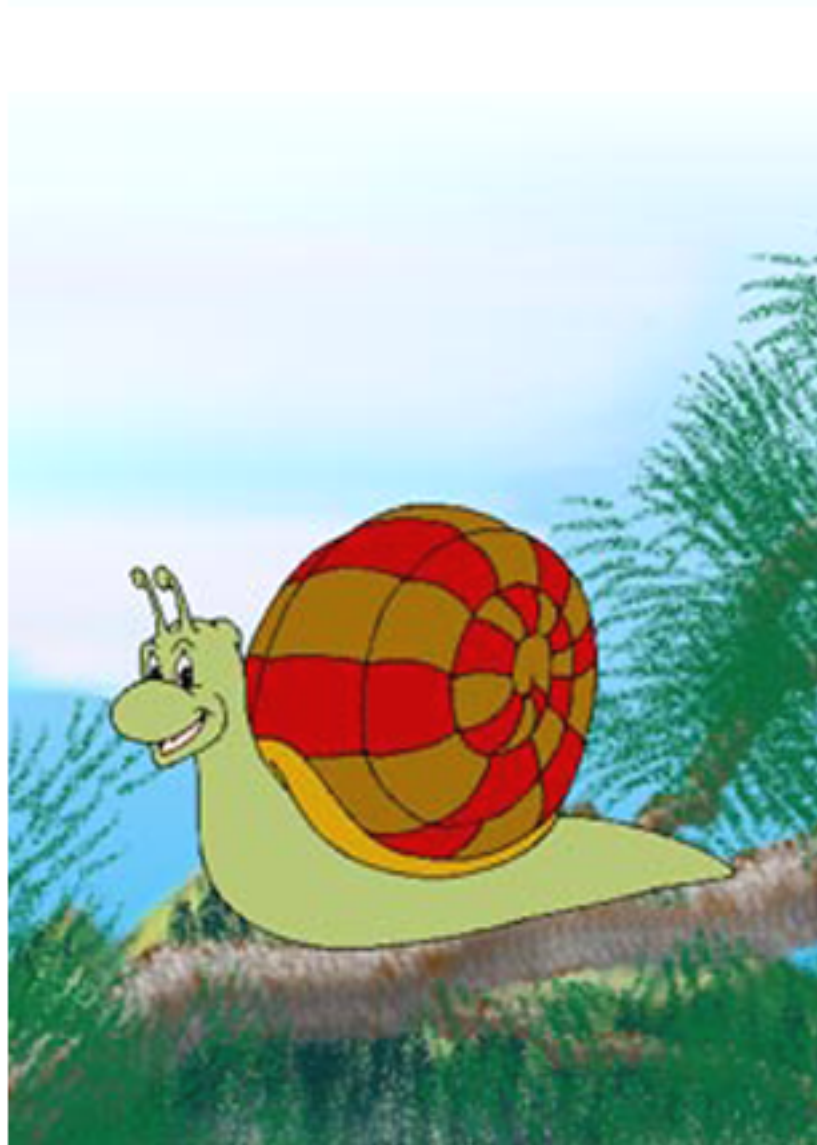
SOMETHING

They might wear feathers, or they might wear shells.

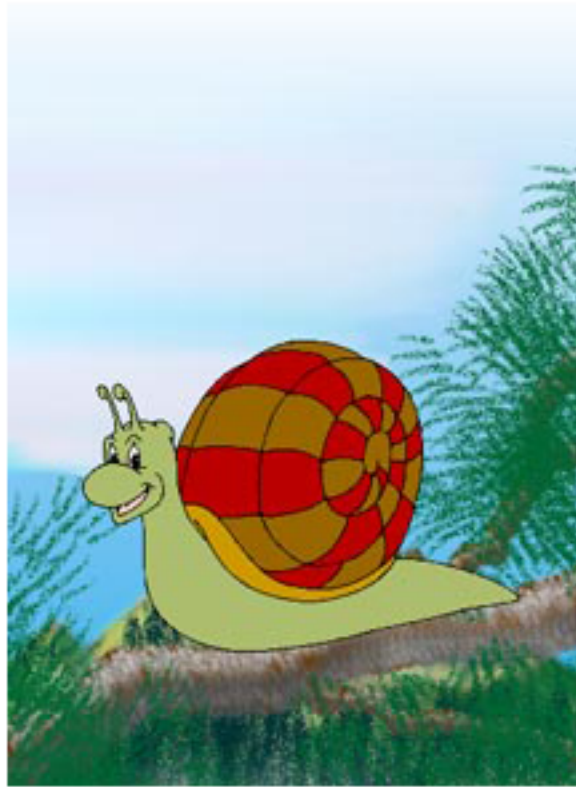
Each animal has its own dress.
