**Lesson Plan**  
**Grades 1-2**

Vocabulary

Contractions: he'd, don't, I'll, there's, wouldn't, you'll, it's

Print Concepts

Capitals for sign, beginning of sentences and names.

Punctuation: quotation marks, question marks, periods, commas, hyphen, exclamation marks, apostrophe to mark the possessive

Phonological Awareness

Endings: /-ed/ rained, snowed, tired, sniffed, moved, figured, settled, jabbed, yipped, blinked, barked, growled, tried, attacked, pounced, whined, sneezed, perked, scratched, bothered

/-est/ meanest, ugliest

Lesson: Circle Story- Sequence of Events

Materials: paper plates

Pencils/markers

Students will divide a paper plate into five sections. The first section should have the title and author written in it. Illustrate and write about the story in the remaining four sections on the plate. Explain that *House For Sale* is a circle story because Felix ends up living where he started in the beginning of the story.
