America originally had thirteen colonies. Colonies are groups of people who live together that are ruled from somewhere else.






The colonies in America were ruled by King George of England.





In June 1776 a group was formed to write a declaration of independence to give to the King of England. A declaration is a way of saying something important. The colonies wanted to be free.






On June 28, 1776 Thomas Jefferson, an important leader, gave the declaration to congress. Congress is a group of people who get together to make laws.

John Hancock was the first to sign the Declaration of Independence. He signed his name with big letters and said, "King George can read *that* without his glasses!"

Government offices like the Post office are closed.






Families get together and have picnics outside.






Many people make barbeques with friends and family.
