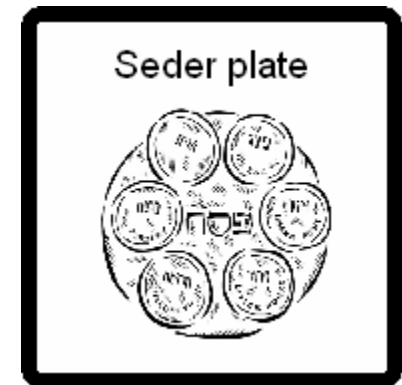
Passover is a Jewish holiday celebrated in the springtime.



On Passover, Jewish families  
don't eat bread.



Before Passover, Jewish families clean their houses from top to bottom, and search the house for crumbs.

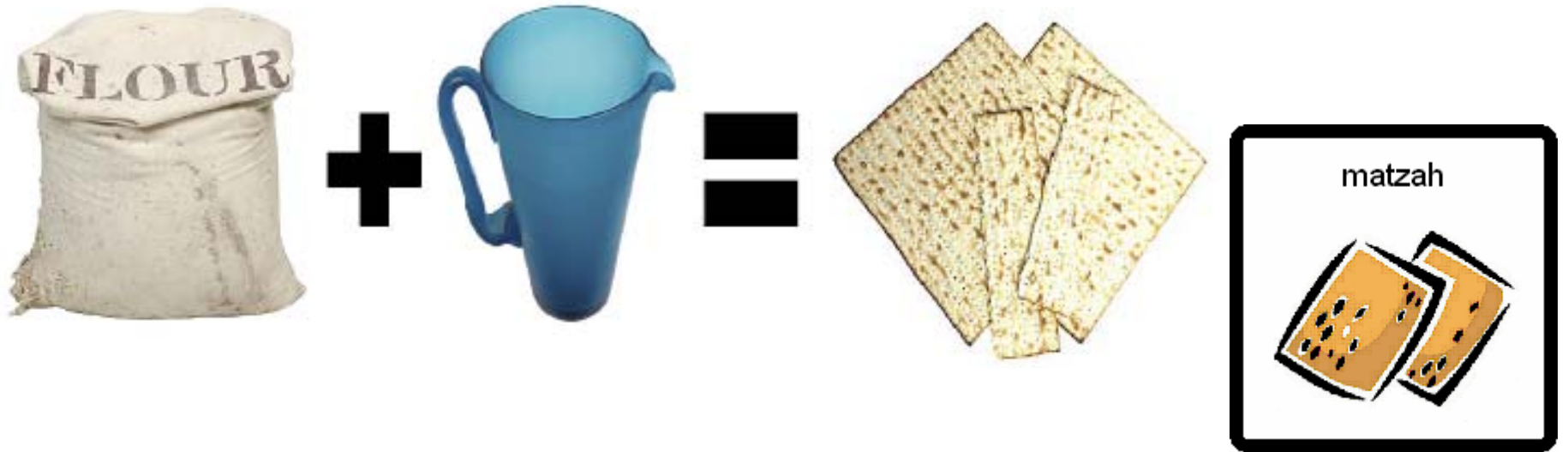


On Passover night there is a special meal called a Seder. The word Seder means order. A special plate is used that has the foods of the Seder on it.

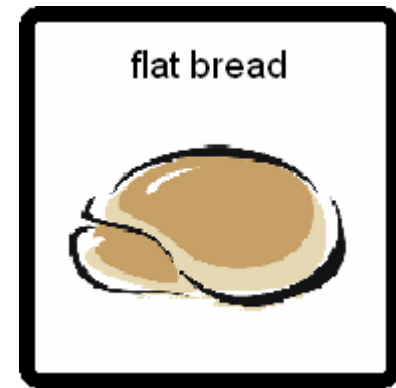




The Passover Seder talks about the Jewish slaves leaving Egypt, and becoming a free people.



One special food eaten at the Seder is Matzah. Matzah is unleavened bread, made from only flour and water.



When the Jewish people left Egypt, they left so fast that the bread didn't have time to rise. That is where Matzah came from.





On Passover night we eat bitter herbs. Romaine lettuce and horseradish root are traditional. The bitter herbs remind us of the bitterness of slavery.



At the Seder, we drink four cups of wine, or grape juice. The drinking of wine celebrates freedom.



At the Seder, we do many different things to encourage the children to ask questions. Passover is a fun holiday to celebrate!

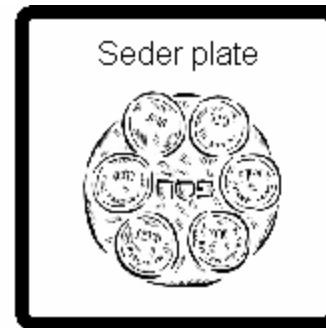
