LESSON PLAN GRADE 1-3 The Baby-Sitter

LESSON TITLE: Learning to use Prewriting Webs before Writing

OBJECTIVE: The students will understand the usefulness of Prewriting Webs to list and organize their writing ideas before writing a first draft.

MATERIALS: Book *The Baby-Sitter*, Prewriting Web Printable (one for each student), My Favorite Baby-Sitter Writing Draft Printable (one for each student), The Baby-Sitter Illustration Printable (one for each student).

LESSON PLAN

- 1. **ENGAGE:** Ask students to raise their hand if they had a baby-sitter watch them while their parents were gone. Call on a few students to share their experience of having a baby-sitter. Tell the students they are going to view a story about a baby-sitter.
- 2. **TEACH:** Tell students that they are going to write about their baby-sitter. Explain to students that all great writers have strategies to make their writing clear, organized and thoughtful. Explain that the most helpful strategy to start with is the Prewriting Web.
- 3. On the board, draw a prewriting web and demonstrate how to fill it in step-by-step using your favorite childhood baby-sitter. (Students will get a kick learning that their teacher once had a baby-sitter!) Write the name of your favorite babysitter in the large bubble in the center of the web. Then, fill in characteristics of your baby-sitter, the activities you did with her/him and the foods you ate with your baby-sitter. Then, write a brief story using the information from the web. Verbalize your thinking process as you refer to your prewriting web as you write your baby-sitter story on the board.
- 4. **GUIDED PRACTICE:** Draw a new prewriting web on the board. Call on volunteers to come up to board to fill in the web and write a brief story utilizing the information from their web. Make sure students choose one baby-sitter, fill the baby-sitter's name in the large bubble in the center, then fill in the outer bubbles with the details about the baby-sitter.
- 5. **INDEPENDENT PRACTICE:** Tell students they are ready to write their favorite baby-sitter story on their own. Hand out the Prewriting Web Printables, the My Favorite Baby-sitter Writing Draft Printable, and the Baby-Sitter Illustration Printable.
- 6. The directions and expectations of the writing assignment are: First, students are to fill in the prewriting web ideas.

<u>Second</u>, students will write a true story about their baby-sitter on the Writing Draft Printable.

<u>Third</u>, students may illustrate and color a picture of their baby-sitter on the Baby-Sitter Illustration Printable.

7. **ASSESSMENT:** Collect the students' work which should include three parts: the Prewriting Web Printable, the Writing Draft Printable and the Illustration Printable. Grade according to directions followed, quality, completeness.
